REGULATIONS AND GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The Marshall-Putnam Fair, celebrating 105 Years, will be held at 915 University Avenue, Henry, Illinois 61537, Sunday, July 12, 2026, through Sunday, July 19, 2026.

***** **PLEASE NOTE** – All entries, except those exhibiting in one-day (jackpot) shows, must be made in person or by mail (postmarked) no later than **JULY 1, 2026**. Address entries to Marshall-Putnam Fair, P.O. Box 114, Henry, Illinois 61537.

- 1. Walk-in entries will be accepted in the Fair Office Monday – Thursday from June 15, 2026, through July 1, 2026.** Entries may also be mailed but postmarked no later than July 1, 2026. Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by a completed entry form, proper release form signatures, and payment of entry fees, stall/pen fees, and exhibitor permits.
2. Any exhibitor/participant of our fair receiving more than \$600 in premiums/monetary awards will be required to complete a W-9 before receiving their premium/award check. **The Marshall-Putnam Fair Association reserves the right to request exhibitors/participants to produce an acceptable copy or original of their Social Security Card if requested. The Fair Association also reserves the right to request proof of age of any junior exhibitor.**
3. The management reserves the right to reject any person's entry deemed unsatisfactory.
- 4. All exhibitors/participants will be required to sign a Release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement. Anyone under the age of 18 will need a parent's signature on the form. Failure to sign this release automatically voids your entry. THIS FORM CAN BE FOUND ON PAGE 2 OF ALL ENTRY FORMS OR ON OUR WEBSITE UNDER THE FAIR BOOK TAB.**
5. Entries can be made in person or by mail by giving name, address, phone number, email, date of birth for all junior exhibitors, department, section number, and the class number you wish to enter. **Entries will be determined by the class number given on the entry form. Entry forms may be photocopied if additional space is needed.** Signatures on Release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement (mentioned in #4 above) must also be included. Entry fees, stall/pen fees, and exhibitor's permit fees must be included and will not be refunded. **NO ENTRY TAGS WILL BE MAILED. PLEASE PICK UP ENTRY TAGS AT THE FAIR OFFICE BEFORE THE FAIR OR UPON CHECKING IN TO THE FAIRGROUNDS.**
6. Each exhibitor participating in Departments I, J, K, L, M, O, and P must purchase an exhibitor's permit.
7. Neither the office personnel nor any other director of the Association shall disclose to competitors, or any other person, what entries have been made. Only office personnel and other officials of the Association, including superintendents, shall be allowed to know what entries have been made before the entries close.
8. Exhibitors will receive an entry identification tag for each animal or article entered in Departments J, K, L, M, O, and P. This tag specifies the Department, Section, and Class Number of the entry. The tag must be attached and remain attached to the article. These tags must be picked up in the fair office before checking articles in for judging.
9. No animal or article will be entitled to a place on the grounds until entry has been made as stated above, and no animal shall be exhibited for premium unless the exhibitor engages and occupies a stall for the same, except in cases of emergency and then at the discretion of the President.
10. Exhibitors will at all times give their necessary personal attention to whatever they have on exhibition, and at the close of the Fair, take charge of the same.
11. In Departments M, O, and P, no articles purchased in a store, made in a factory, or borrowed, can compete for premiums in these departments (except where noted). All articles must be the work of the exhibitor.

12. Articles or exhibits in all Departments at the Marshall-Putnam Fair will be released according to the rules stated in each department.
13. **Leaving before release time will mean forfeiture of premium checks.**
14. All livestock judging times are listed in the Livestock Schedule. The Art Hall and Commercial Building will be open to the public EXCEPT when judging is in progress.
15. Riding or driving on the track by a person or persons during the exhibition hours, except when competing for premiums/monetary awards, is strictly forbidden.
16. The Board of Directors will take practical care of stock and articles after their arrangement on the grounds. The Board of Directors will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any person, stock, or article.
17. An efficient security force will be on the grounds to maintain order.
18. **All checks written by the Marshall-Putnam Fair Association for premiums, judges, winners, and any other fair expenses MUST be cashed within 60 days of issuance.**
19. Camping facilities, including water and electricity, are available on the fairgrounds for \$35 per day per space (including tent camping). A limited number of 240-volt electrical hook-ups spaces are available for \$40 per day per space. **All camping spaces must be reserved ahead of time. Please complete and return the camping application found under Camping → Fair Time Camping Application on our website.**

AWARDS

1. The judges shall be selected as needed by the Superintendent of various departments.
2. No person shall act as a judge in any class in which they may be an exhibitor or agent of an exhibitor.
3. Where there is no competition, the animal or article shall receive the first premium and ribbon. Any article deemed unworthy by the judge, however, will be disqualified.
4. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges during their adjudication will be promptly excluded from the competition.
5. (a). All protest concerning entries in any department must be made in writing, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds for the protest. The affidavit must be filed with the Superintendent of the Department at least four (4) hours before the awards are made. Such protests will be considered before the hour of judging by a Grievance Committee of three persons appointed by the President of the Association.
5. (b). Protests concerning an award must be filed within six (6) hours after the award was made. The protest must be submitted in writing to the Superintendent of the Department along with written evidence to substantiate the protest. All protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00. A final decision will be made by a Grievance Committee consisting of three persons appointed by the President of the Association. The deposit will be returned if the protest is sustained. Interested parties will be notified, and an opportunity given them to submit evidence.
6. In all cases where protests are entered for improper or malicious purposes, or where there is evidence of fraud on the part of the exhibitor, the Board will exclude the parties practicing such fraud from exhibition on its grounds for two years thereafter; and in all cases where fraud has been practiced on the Board by misrepresentation or false entry, and the same may not be found out until the premiums are paid, the Association holds the right to recover the amount of premiums at any time within six months after the closing of the Fair.
7. Any exhibitor who interferes with the displays or the judging process or who insults a judge shall forfeit all premiums.
8. Should any doubt arise as to the regularity of entry or any other important matter which the judge feels incompetent to decide, they shall at once report the same to the Superintendent of the proper department for decision.

9. Judges are instructed that if they have good reason to believe that any exhibitor, by false entry or otherwise, attempts to deceive the judge or the public and obtain a premium by misrepresentation, they shall report the fact at once to the Superintendent of the Department, who shall immediately instruct the judge that such exhibitor is henceforth excluded from competition in the 2026 Fair.
10. Placings in the Judges' books must be entered in plain, legible handwriting and in the proper space, as the premiums will be paid on the authority of these entries only.
11. The books must be returned by the Superintendent of each department to the Fair Office as soon as the awards are completed.
12. When ribbons are awarded, Superintendents will be particular to observe the following rules (except in horses): Blue ribbons are designed for first premium, Red ribbons for second premium; White ribbons for third premium; Royal Purple ribbons for champions, which will be affixed at the time of the awards.
13. **An exhibitor can win only two premiums per class number.**
14. Any exhibitor/participant of our fair receiving more than \$600 in premiums/monetary awards will be required to complete a W-9 before receiving their premium/award check. **The Marshall-Putnam Fair Association reserves the right to request exhibitors/participants to produce an acceptable copy or original of their Social Security Card if requested.**
15. Decision of the Judge shall be final, except in case of fraud or protest.

RULES APPLICABLE TO ANIMALS

1. All entries, except those exhibiting in one-day (jackpot) shows, must be made in person or by mail (postmarked) no later than **JULY 1, 2026**. Address entries to Marshall-Putnam Fair, P.O. Box 114, Henry, Illinois 61537. Walk-in entries accepted beginning **JUNE 15, 2026**.
2. **ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY A COMPLETED ENTRY FORM, PROPER RELEASE FORM SIGNATURES, AND PAYMENT OF ENTRY FEES, STALL/PEN FEES, AND EXHIBITOR PERMITS.**
3. Any exhibitor/participant of our fair receiving more than \$600 in premiums/monetary awards will be required to complete a W-9 before receiving their premium/award check. **The Marshall-Putnam Fair Association reserves the right to request exhibitors/participants to produce an acceptable copy or original of their Social Security Card if requested. The Fair Association also reserves the right to request proof of age of any junior exhibitor.**
4. No money covering entry fees, stall/pen fees, and exhibitor's permits will be refunded.
5. All animals shown must be entered for competition in the name of the owner.*
6. All livestock must be owned by the party in whose name they are exhibited, and satisfactory proof of such ownership must be furnished to the awarding committee.*
7. A single animal may also be entered as one of a group class and in sweepstakes but shall not otherwise be entered in more than one class.
8. If it is ascertained that an animal is entered in a ring in which it does not properly belong, it is the duty of the Superintendent of the Department to instruct the committee not to award a premium.
9. **ALL PUREBRED LIVESTOCK MUST HAVE REGISTRATION PAPERS IN ORDER TO EXHIBIT. ALL REGISTRATION PAPERS WILL BE CHECKED AND MUST BE IN THE EXHIBITOR'S POSSESSION DURING THE FAIR. IF ANY EXHIBITOR IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION, THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IMMEDIATELY.**
10. **All health papers must be turned in to the Fair Office upon arrival, where they will be checked by the Vet and then returned to the exhibitor before the end of the Fair.**
11. In order to qualify for premiums, entries must be shown.
12. The Bureau of County Fairs requires that all exhibits be on the grounds for at least 72 hours, except one-day (jackpot) shows. See each department's rules for arrival and release times.
13. Animals are not allowed to run at large on the fairgrounds.
14. Animals are to be washed only at the wash racks.

15. No animals shall be allowed a place on the grounds, nor the owner permitted to exhibit the same if said animal shall be suffering from any contagious disease. The Board reserves the right to exclude any class of animals when, in their judgment, the interest of the community demands such action.

16. **No paper bedding may be used.** The Swine Department will not allow straw bedding - **SHAVINGS ONLY.** Shavings **will not** be available for purchase from the Fair Association.

17. **FAN RULE:** All fans for livestock must be caged and hung out of the aisle. **NO BUTT FANS.** **Exception for any livestock in tents:** Normal household fans may be used with the approval of the Superintendent.

18. **Extension Cords:** All extension cords for fans must be outdoor approved - heavy gauge.

19. **Appropriate space will be provided for the parking of livestock trailers near the west end of the fairgrounds (off the west entrance road).** **Those improperly parked will be towed at the owner's expense.**

*One-Day Horse Shows are governed by their sanctioning organization.

SUPERINTENDENTS OF DEPARTMENTS

1. Each Superintendent of Department will have the arrangement and supervision of all articles or animals on exhibition in their department and be responsible to the Board for their management of the same.

2. They shall afford the judge every facility of examination; will affix ribbons under the direction of the Judges; shall have charge of the books, and when awards are finished, return the books to the Fair Office.

3. They will give such instructions to the Judge before entering upon the performance of the duties as will enable them to decide all questions that may come up for their consideration in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board.

4. All Superintendents are asked to make a written report within 90 days following the close of the Fair to the Board of Directors for their consideration of any suggestions for improvements in their respective departments.

PREMIUMS

1. The premium list has been carefully revised and, the offerings are as liberal as the Association can afford.

2. Premium winners are advised that no payment will be made until such time as a complete check of all receipts of the Fair has been made and the condition of the treasury fully ascertained.

3. **The Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the premium book.**

4. The Association reserves the right, in the event the receipts of the Fair are not sufficient to pay all premiums in full, to pay premium monies on a percentage basis.

5. Any exhibitor/participant of our fair receiving more than \$600 in premiums/monetary awards will be required to complete a W-9 before receiving their premium/award check. **The Marshall-Putnam Fair Association reserves the right to request exhibitors/participants to produce an acceptable copy or original of their Social Security Card if requested.**

6. **Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of issuance.**

CONCESSIONS

The Concession Chairmen will lease all privileges, locate all tents, stands, and concessions, and may annul any permit at any time for any cause unsatisfactory to the Chairmen. **PRIVILEGES MUST BE PAID IN FULL AT THE FAIR OFFICE ON FAIRGROUNDS BEFORE SETTING UP.** All privileges not paid for according to this rule will be forfeited. **All food stands must pass health inspection and provide a current Certificate of Food Liability before operating.**

A Concession Contract will provide more details. To obtain a copy, which includes the Rules and Regulations and current space rental fees and electrical hook-up rates, please contact the Fair Office (309) 364-2814.

ATTENTION

1. No alcoholic beverage will be allowed on the fairgrounds except in designated areas.
2. All pets must be on a leash and leash in hand. All pets on our fairgrounds MUST have proof of rabies vaccination with them and available to the Fair Association upon request. No pets (except service animals) are allowed in grandstand/infield seating areas.
3. No skateboards or roller blades/skates allowed on fairground property. All bicycles entering our fairgrounds must be left in a designated area by the front gate. Marshall-Putnam Fair Association is not responsible for stolen or damaged bikes or other property brought to our fairgrounds.
4. No one under the age of 21 will be allowed in the Activity Building after 9:00 pm on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights and after 10:00 pm on Sunday night (even if accompanied by a parent or guardian).
6. Because we care about your health, please remember to wash your hands before eating, especially after contact with animals.

1. The Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the premium book.
2. **The Association reserves the right, in the event the receipts of the Fair are not sufficient to pay all premiums in full, to pay premium monies on a percentage basis.**
3. **Premium Checks and Special Awards will be handed out in the Fair Office according to the following schedule:**
 - Department H5 on Saturday, July 18, 2026, at 6:00 pm
 - Department H1 on Sunday, July 19, 2026, at 5:00 pm
 - Departments J, K, L, M, O, P on Sunday, July 19, 2026, at 5:00 pm
 - Departments F, I1, and I2 on Sunday, July 19, 2026, at 7:00 pm
 - Department G/G1/G2 Sunday, July 19, 2026, approximately one hour after the end of the full swine show, but not before 7:00 pm
4. **It is preferred that the exhibitor winning the premium please pick up their check and sign the Premium Statement.** If this is not possible, a family member or friend will be allowed to pick up the exhibitors check but must follow the proper procedure set forth by the State of Illinois. This will require that person to sign their name and provide their address on the Premium Statement. Please pick up checks before leaving the fairgrounds. **PREMIUM CHECKS WILL NOT BE MAILED.**
5. When picking up checks please enter and leave through the back door of the Fair Office.
6. Any exhibitor/participant of our fair receiving more than \$600 in premiums/monetary awards will be required to complete a W-9 before receiving their premium/award check. **The Marshall-Putnam Fair Association reserves the right to request exhibitors/participants to produce an acceptable copy or original of their Social Security Card if requested.**
7. **Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of issuance.**

2026 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements County Fairs

I. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present on County Fairgrounds, including livestock that are not entered in competitive events. Species specific information follows the general requirements.

2. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.

3. All out-of-state animals must have an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

4. All animals, except as noted in species specific information below, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI).

5. All animals shall be officially identified.

6. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to County Fairgrounds. Examination may include but is not limited to ultrasound, urine testing, and similar actions.

7. Definitions, abbreviations, and administration:

a. The Illinois Department of Agriculture may be referred to as "Department" or "IDOA"

b. The Department contains a Bureau of Animal Health and Welfare, which receives all CVIs.

c. Department or IDOA staff, as used in this document, includes all Bureaus

8. IDOA will continue to monitor state and federal trends in animal health as it relates to this document. Any updates to these requirements will be posted on our website.

II. CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS

9. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) means a legible record, made on an official form from the state of origin, containing an accurate description or identification of the animal including age, sex, breed, health status, and vaccination information.

10. The CVI must be signed, dated, and issued by a licensed and accredited veterinarian in that state.

11. Submitted CVIs must be as originally issued by the veterinarian; no CVIs with alterations, edits, or changes, will be accepted. The CVI must show that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois (species specific information noted later in this guidance)

12. CVI must show the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor.

13. CVI must include the animal's Animal Identification Number.

a. Animal identification number (AIN): A numbering system for the official identification of individual animals in the United States that provides a nationally unique identification number for each animal. The AIN consists of 15 digits, with the first 3 being the country code (840 for the United States or a unique country code for any U.S. territory that has such a code and

elects to use it in place of the 840 code).

14. If one CVI is used for multiple animals, each animal identification must be made on a separate line.
15. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to obtain electronic CVIs whenever possible; IDOA is moving toward only accepting electronic CVIs.
16. Exhibitors shall make CVIs available to Department of Agriculture and County Fair staff on request.
 - a. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show County Fair staff or Bureau of Animal Health and Welfare Personnel the completed CVI.
17. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
18. CVIs for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
19. CVIs for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.

III. QUARANTINE AND REMOVAL

20. Quarantine shall be at the animal owner (or exhibitor) risk and expense.
21. Quarantine and removal from the Fairgrounds shall be as determined appropriate by the County Fair Veterinarian, State Veterinarian, or their designee(s).
22. Quarantine will be required until the animal has been properly treated and recovered, or the animal can be released to return to the owner's premise, both in the opinion of the County Fair Veterinarian, State Veterinarian, or their designee(s).
23. Any animal presenting with a condition that would subject it to quarantine must be withdrawn from any/all entered competitions and are not permitted to exhibit.
24. Any condition meriting quarantine may also result in required removal of the animal from the Fairgrounds, as determined appropriate by the County Fair Veterinarian, State Veterinarian, or their designee(s).
25. Conditions subject to quarantine (not an exhaustive list)
 - a. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be held in quarantine.
 - b. Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination
 - c. Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses
 - d. Suspicion of or diagnosis of a foreign animal disease, emerging animal disease, or other actionable disease, animals may be subject to quarantine on the fairgrounds until such time that it is determined that the disease is no longer a threat.
26. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry back into the state.

IV. SPECIES SPECIFIC INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

The information included below for any species is in addition to the requirements noted above. There are no additional species-specific information or requirements for llamas, pigeons, or rabbits.

CATTLE

Identification:

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Illinois Cattle:

Brucellosis

- ♣ Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State and an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Brucellosis and Tuberculin testing are not required for Illinois cattle.
- ♣ Illinois calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

- ♣ Brucellosis
 1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a “Class Free” state (if entire state is so classified).
 - D. Animal is a steer or spayed heifer.
 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.
- ♣ Tuberculosis
 1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required.
 2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

SWINE

Identification: Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, (“840” tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Illinois Swine: Brucellosis and Pseudorabies testing are not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine:

- ♣ Brucellosis
 1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
 2. Swine brucellosis tests shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.
- ♣ Pseudorabies
 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
 2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
 3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within 10 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.
 4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification:

- ♣ Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.
- ♣ Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. If the tattoos are not visible, another form of official identification must be presented.
- ♣ When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs: All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Scrapie: Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.

CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification:

- ♣ Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.
- ♣ Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. If the tattoos are not visible, another form of official identification must be presented. o Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.
- ♣ When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Scrapie: Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.

CVI must include the herd of birth and the herd of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

Goats from states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must also have the following information included on their CVI:

- (1) that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and
- (2) the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Equine Infectious Anemia

- ♣ All horses and other Equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older entering the Fairgrounds, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within twelve (12) months.
- ♣ A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- ♣ AGID (Coggins) or ELISA test are accepted.

Illinois Equine: A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine: All horses and other Equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

POULTRY

1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e., domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized 4 testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the State Veterinarian or their designee or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be removed from exhibition and must be removed from the Fairgrounds.
5. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the Fair will be removed from the Fairgrounds.
6. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.

CERVIDAE: Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species

Identification: All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

Illinois Cervidae

♣ **Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD):** For cervidae moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Illinois Department of Agriculture prior to movement. The cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- A) Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- B) Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- C) Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- D) Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

♣ **Tuberculosis:** Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae.

Out-of-State Cervidae. All Cervidae entering Illinois must:

1. Be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at 217/782-6384.
2. Be accompanied by a permit from the Illinois Department of Agriculture
3. Have a CVI that:
 - a. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
 - b. shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease;
 - c. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.

4. Brucellosis: Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

5. Tuberculosis

- a. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States: All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) tests for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds. These animals shall be 5 isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.
 1. Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
 2. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.
- b. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 1. All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 2. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional TB tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

RATITES: Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis

Illinois Ratites: There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

Out-of-State Ratites

1. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
2. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

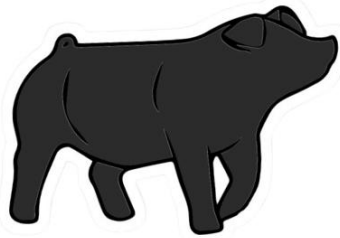

Herdsman Award



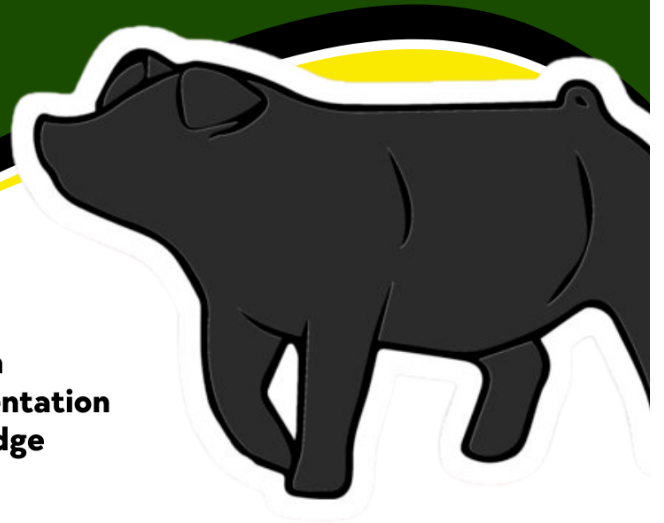
About:

ALL SWINE WILL BE RELEASED FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF THE SHOW. PREMIUM CHECKS AND HEALTH PAPERS WILL BE AVAILABLE TO PICK UP AT THE FAIR OFFICE APPROXIMATELY 1 HOUR AFTER THE COMPLETION OF THE SHOW, BARRING NO ISSUES.

It is preferred that the exhibitor winning the premium please pick up their check and sign the Premium Statement. If this is not possible, a family member or friend will be allowed to pick up the exhibitors check but must follow the proper procedure set forth by the State of Illinois. This will require that person to sign their name and provide their address on the Premium Statement.

When picking up checks, please enter and leave through the **back (south)** door of the Fair Office.

Any exhibitor/participant of our fair receiving more than \$600 in premiums/monetary awards will be required to complete a W-9 before receiving their premium/award check.

Purebred Swine Show Rules & Policies

Rule 1 — Authority of the Swine Superintendent and Assistant Superintendents

The Swine Superintendent and his/her appointed Assistant Superintendents shall have shared authority with the fair board over the administration and operation of the swine show. Their authority shall include, but not be limited to: Eligibility, Animal classification, Class breaks, Entry verification, Rule interpretation, Show procedures, Disqualifications, Enforcement of all show rules and policies.

In the absence of the Swine Superintendent, an Assistant Superintendent or a member of the Livestock Board Representative Committee may act on behalf of the Superintendent and exercise the same authority.

Rule 2 – Ownership Requirements (Open Jackpot Show Only)

This is an open jackpot show; therefore, no ownership deadline applies. Animals may be shown regardless of length of ownership. All entries must be made in the name of the exhibitor who will show the animal. The exhibitor listed at the check-in will be considered the official exhibitor for the duration of the show. Substitution of exhibitors after check-in is not permitted without approval of show management. All swine show entries must be listed under the individual exhibitor's name on the official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or health papers. Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI by its ear notch. Animals not properly listed or identified may be denied entry or disqualified. All purebred gilts and barrows must be properly registered and recorded on the official pedigree in the name of the exhibitor at the time of check-in. Registration papers must be available for verification upon request. Any falsification or misrepresentation of exhibitor or ownership information including CVI documentation, ear notches, or pedigree records, will result in disqualification and may result in further disciplinary action as determined by show officials. Any concerns or disputes regarding ownership, identification, pedigree, or exhibitor eligibility must be filed in accordance with the Exhibitor Complaint/Protest Policy. Complaints not submitted within the required time frame, not filed by an eligible party, or not supported by sufficient evidence will not be considered and will be deemed null and void.

Rule 3 — Eligibility Requirements

All Purebred Breeding Gilts and Purebred Barrows must be farrowed on or after January 1, 2026. Animals born prior to January 1, 2026, shall be ineligible to compete. NO DECEMBER BORN PUREBRED GILTS OR PUREBRED BARROWS ARE ELIGIBLE TO BE SHOWN IN EITHER THE JUNIOR SWINE SHOW OR THE OPEN JACKPOT SHOW. Birth dates must be verified through official registration papers or breed association records approved by the Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendents, and Livestock Board Representative Committee. Following state regulations and guidelines. Health papers are required for ALL entries. A Certificate of Veterinarian Inspection no more than 90 days past the date of issuance is required for in-state hogs. A CVI no more than 30 days past the date of issuance is required for out-of-state hogs. Out of state animals will also need an entry permit number on the CVI.

Rule 4 — Verification and Enforcement

The Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendents, and Livestock Board Representative Committee shall have full authority to verify: Birth dates, Registration Status, Breed Eligibility, Ownership Requirements, Animal Identification, Exhibitor compliance. Any animal determined to be ineligible may be reclassified, removed from competition, or disqualified.

Rule 5 – Minimum Weight Requirements –

There is no minimum weight requirement for Crossbred Breeding Gilts, Purebred Market Barrow, or Crossbred Market Barrows.

Rule 6 – Crossbred Qualifications

Light Crossbreds Qualifications: Light Crossbred will be defined as blues, blue belts, red roans, red belts, calicos, or any pigs with predominantly white bodies and black or red spots.

Dark Crossbred Qualifications: Dark Crossbred will be defined as black belts, solid blacks, and predominantly black bodies with chromed up white markings.

Rule 7 — Class Break Authority

For Crossbred Breeding Gilts, Purebred Market Barrow, and Crossbred Market Barrows - All animals will be shown in classes as determined by the Swine Superintendent based on declared weights and established class breads. Exact numerical equality between classes shall not be required. The Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendents, and Livestock Fair Board Representative reserves the right to combine divide or adjust classes as necessary to ensure fair and competitive class sizes and class distribution.

All class breaks for Purebred Breeding Gilts, Purebred Barrows, Crossbred Gilts, and Crossbred Barrows shall be established by the Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendents, and Livestock Fair Board Representative. Classes may be divided by: Breed, Birthdate, Age, Number of Entries or Weight (if deemed necessary). All class breaks shall be final. If you feel there is a clerical error, please contact the Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, or the Livestock Board Representative Committee. All clerical errors **MUST** be corrected before the beginning of the show. Top 2 placing hogs, in each barrow and crossbred gilt class, will be reweighed. ****6% WEIGH BACK****

Rule 8 — Adjustment of Class Breaks

The Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent and/or Livestock Board Representative Committee reserve the right to: Split oversized classes, Combine undersized classes, Adjust classes as necessary to ensure fair and efficient competition.

Rule 9 — Equal Distribution Policy

When practical, classes will be divided to maintain reasonably balanced numbers of entries. Exact numerical equality shall not be required.

Rule 10 — Breed Divisions

Breed classes may be established, combined, modified, or eliminated based upon: Number of entries:

(4) Four head makes a breed class, less than (4) head, the animal will show as AOB.

Rule 11 — Error Correction

The Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent and/or Livestock Board Representative Committee may correct: Entry errors, Breed classification errors, Birthdate errors, Identification errors, or Clerical mistakes at any time prior to the beginning of the show. These changes **MUST** be reported to fair office in a timely matter for adjusted judging sheets to be printed.

Rule 12 – Champions and Reserves

Only 1st and 2nd place hogs are eligible for champions and reserves unless the breed only has one class then the 34d place hog will be automatically awarded. That's the only exception to the rule.

Rule 13 – Entries

There are no limits on the number of entries per exhibitor. **Each exhibitor can win only two premiums per class.** Substitutions are allowed up until the official check in.

Rule 14 – Late Entry Policy

Entries submitted after the designated Junior Swine Show entry deadline will only be accepted if and only if approved by both the Swine Superintendent and the Fair Office. Requests for late entry consideration will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Approval of a late entry is not guaranteed and will be granted solely at the discretion of the Swine Superintendent and Fair Office. A double entry fee will be charged for all approved late entries submitted after the designated entry deadline. All decisions regarding late entry requests, approvals, denials, and applicable fees are final. **(This rule will not apply in 2026 due to the late posting of our book.)**

Rule 15 — Show Day Authority

On show day, the Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendents, and/or Livestock Board Representative Committee may combine classes, split classes, reorder classes, or change class sequence only prior to the printing of final judging sheets.

Rule 16 — Protest and Appeals

If there is a challenge to class breaks, classifications, eligibility determinations, or procedural decisions, etc. please see the Swine Superintendent, Assistant Superintendents, and/or Livestock Board Representative Committee. These complaints **MUST** be filed in writing, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds for the protest to the Swine Superintendent and/or Livestock Fair Board Representative at least four (4) hours before the awards are made. Such protests will be considered prior to the start of the show by a Grievance Committee of three persons appointed by the President of the Marshall-Putnam Fair Association. If the complaint is discovered during the show, the complainant **MUST** follow the same procedure as written above.

Exhibitor Complaint / Protest Policy- All complaints or protests concerning awards must be filed within (1) one hour after the end of the show. The protest must be submitted in writing to the Superintendent of the Department along with written evidence to substantiate the protest. All protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00. A final decision will be made by a Grievance Committee consisting of three persons appointed by the President of the Association. The deposit will be returned if the protest is sustained. Interested parties will be notified and an opportunity given for them to submit evidence.

Acceptable supporting evidence may include, but is not limited to: photographs or video clearly documenting the issue, Relevant registration or ownership documentation, veterinary records or written statements from a licensed veterinarian, Official identification records, including ear notches, ear tags, tattoos, registration papers, Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), or health certificates, Direct references to specific premium book rules or class requirements.

Unsportsmanlike conduct, harassment of show officials, judges, exhibitors, volunteers, or failure to follow the established complaint and protest procedure may result in disciplinary action, including removal from the show, forfeiture of awards and premiums, and /or disqualification.

Rule 17. Swine Pens

All swine penning assignments shall be made solely by the Swine Committee. Assignments will be based on exhibitor entries, number of animals, barn capacity, and facility requirements to maintain a safe and orderly environment. Pen locations are assigned as issued. No exhibitor shall change, exchange, or occupy any pen other than the one assigned. Requests for specific pen locations will not be accepted. Unauthorized changes or failure to comply with assigned penning may result in removal of animals and/or disciplinary action, as determined by fair officials. **All penning decisions are final.**

Please stop in the office prior to showing to get your receipt and double check for accuracy. No changes will be made at the show ring.

No money covering fees or pens will be refunded.

AGE RULING – Junior classes are open to boys and girls who are eight (8) years of age or in third grade and not yet twenty-one (21) years of age on or before September 1 of the year previous to the fair.

All animals (i.e., individual, herd or flock classes) shown in junior classes must be the property of the boys or girls showing them. If the same animals are shown in both the open classes and junior classes, they shall be shown under the same exhibitor's name (for example, the father is not permitted to show an animal in the open class and the son or daughter show the same animal in the junior classes).
ALL EXHIBITORS MUST BE PRESENT TO SHOW THEIR OWN ANIMALS.

ALL PUREBRED LIVESTOCK MUST HAVE REGISTRATION PAPERS IN ORDER TO EXHIBIT. ALL REGISTRATION PAPERS WILL BE CHECKED AND MUST BE IN THE EXHIBITOR’S POSSESSION DURING THE FAIR. IF ANY EXHIBITOR IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION, THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IMMEDIATELY.

No paper bedding may be used.

All animals must meet the state health rulings required in the open class exhibits. Please see Health Requirements for official rules. All Health Papers must be turned into the Fair Office upon arrival where they will be checked by the Vet and then returned to the exhibitor before the end of the fair.

Anyone using a generator must specify this on the entry form. If electricity is available, additional fans will be charged at \$10 per day per fan. All extension cords for fans must be outdoor approved - heavy gauge.

We do NOT provide bedding. Each exhibitor must provide their own bedding. No paper bedding may be used.

See health requirements governing exhibits in the department.

All health papers must be turned into the Fair Office upon arrival, where the Vet will check them.

Leaving before release time will mean forfeiture of premium checks.

All heifers over two years of age must give satisfactory evidence to the judge of being breeders or being expelled from the competition. Superintendents will strictly enforce this rule.

All animals over six months of age are to be registered.

All steers must have a calf mouth (all baby teeth) with no permanent teeth showing or evidence thereof.

All steers must have been dropped on or after January 1, 2025.

Steers will weigh on Friday, July 17, 2026, at 5:30 p.m. The committee will determine which class steers shall show in, and their decision is final.

ALL PUREBRED LIVESTOCK, INCLUDING AOB, MUST HAVE REGISTRATION PAPERS TO EXHIBIT. ALL REGISTRATION PAPERS WILL BE CHECKED AND MUST BE IN THE EXHIBITOR'S POSSESSION DURING THE FAIR. IF ANY EXHIBITOR IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION, THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IMMEDIATELY.

All entries must be COMPETITION READY. Competition ready is defined as follows: articles must be CLEAN, FRESHLY PRESSED (where pressing is appropriate), and in EXCELLENT CONDITION. Items that are soiled, stained, torn, or show signs of wear will not be considered for judging.

Articles to be exhibited must be the work of the exhibitor. No purchased items, except where listed, will be considered for judging. In the case of quilts, the entire quilt must be the exhibitor's work, except where stated otherwise.

Wall hangings/pictures need to be appropriately framed and/or ready to hang. Professional framing is allowed. It is not necessary to include a hanging rod for large, quilted wall hangings, as the textile department will provide display hardware.

Garments must be submitted on appropriate hangers. Exceptions to this rule include knitted, crocheted garments, or any garment where hanging would be undesirable and cause damage to the article.

Plastic coverings for articles are not required. Articles will be displayed without plastic, in most cases, unless the exhibitor specifically requests that articles remain wrapped for display. Hangers and plastic coverings should be labeled to ensure the proper return to owners.

PLAN OF RACING: USTA, Department of Agriculture, County Fair and Northern Illinois Colt Association Rules to govern when not covered in the following conditions. All races are two (one-mile) dashes unless otherwise specified.

When a race program is canceled for reasons beyond control of said Fair, and the program can be raced the following day, the Fair reserves the right to race as many of the canceled events as can be programmed without interfering with previously scheduled entertainment. The Fair reserves the right, as time permits, to race on a one or two heat plan.

Fields will be divided by colts and fillies where possible. However, in no case shall extra divisions for fillies be made, nor shall short fields be started to accommodate fillies. When raced as eliminations, the elimination heats will race for 60% of the estimated purse and the final heat race for 40%.

Published purses estimated. Distribution of purses will be: 50%, 25%, 12%, 8%, and 5% for five finishers. In all Northern Illinois Colt Association Stake events when a race is caused to be divided the purse will be equally divided among all of the divisions, except in the case of separate colt and filly divisions where the March 15 payments will follow the sex. The Northern Illinois Colt Association supports any drug testing done by the Illinois Department of Agriculture or any other agency.

Overnight events contested on the Northern Illinois Colt Association circuit:

When an overnight event is split into more than one division, the Fair reserves the right to race on a one-heat plan.

Right is reserved by the Fairs to retain that part of the purse not raced for in all of the overnight races.

In all overnight races right is reserved to require 5 to enter and 4 to start. Where the entries are more than can start in one race, the race will be divided. The Fair will add 50% of the original purse and race in divisions. Each division will race for an equal share of the total purse.

All County Fairs are strongly encouraged to display their USTA license on the race office wall so that the license will be visible to anyone who enters the race office. Anyone who requires to be licensed must be able to prove to race officials that they are currently licensed by USTA at time of race. Drivers who do not hold a current USTA license are not eligible to drive in County Fair Races.

Fair reserves the right to assign stalls on a first come basis. Horsemen racing on the Northern Illinois Colt Association are responsible for carrying their own driver-accident insurance.
